

WINTERING BEES

Probably the most convenient place first step in this direction is to be assured that the cellar can be kept ones) suspended on cleats, 3 feet from sufficiently warm to prevent the ground, without a bottom, comb pe partitioned off from the rest for this purpose and provided with sufficient entilation to allow the escape of foul air and also to regulate the temperature should there be any danger of it rising too high, which would cause the bees to become restless and crawl outside the hives. After a number of col onies are put into a cellar the temperature will be several degrees higher than it formerly was on account of the warmth of the bees.

Where the maple leaf beds on treestles are used, the bottom should be removed This aids in maintaining interior uni form temperature, and at the same time ensures perfect ventilation from

Many very excellent and successful beekeepers tier up the hives. They loosen the bottoms the night before, then next day carry the bees in gently, leaving the bottoms behind. The first row of hives may be supported 1 foot or more from cellar bottom, 8 inches apart, the next one above and over the TORONTO
