During the last few days very great improvements have been wrought in the appearance of Willow Bank Cemetery. The old graveyards have been cleaned up and new ones made, and a number of the less ornamental natural trees have been removed. The intended improvements are not yet completed but already a great change for the better has been effected.

The street committee have begun the work referred to in a former issue of putting a large sewer down Wharf street to the creek to carry off the surface water. The pipe will be a foot in diameter and laid at such a descent as to assure its efficiency. Three catch-basins will be constructed to prevent the stoppage of the pipe by sand or other matter washing down from the high ground. This work is a most important one and if properly constructed should be of great benefit to Main street especially.

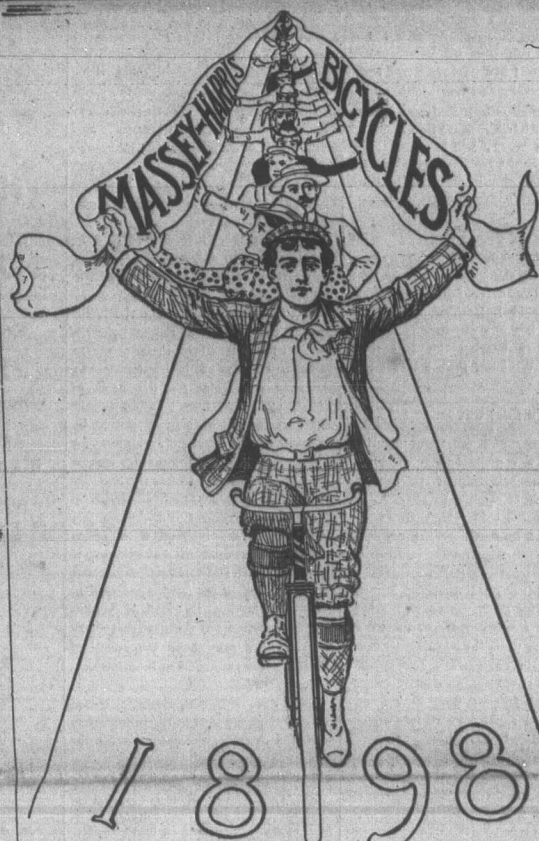
