THE ROYAL VISIT.

Plans Being Prepared for the Reception of the
Heir Apparent to the Throne.

Heavy Demands Will be Made on Localities
for Guards of Honor and Escorts.

GRAND MILITARY REVIEW.

OTTAWA, July 4.—It is suggested that the various places to be visited by the Duke of Cornwall and party at once organize their reception, making features as distinctly local as possible.

Major General O'Grady Haley, who returned last evening from visiting the camp, has been supplied by Major Maude, military secretary, with the details of H's Excellency the Governor General's requirements in connection with the Royal visit, and is now engaged in planning the necessary arrangements to meet them. It is understood that wherever the heir apparent goes he will be met by a royal salute and a guard of honor and accompanied in his goings out by a cavalry escort. A

royal escort consists of 96 men and five officers and as in some places two and even three escorts will be needed in a day, and as there are very few cities which can supply a body of cavalry over 500 strong, the above will mean a large amount of transportation of men and horses, in order to satisfy the requirements of the occasion. The guard of honor will be supplied by the local corps.

The historic Plains of Abraham will in all probability be the scene of the review of troops of the province, including the Montreal brigade. Heavy demands for guards of honor and escorts may greatly curtail the military displays in some places. In Ontario, troops from Ottawa and West will meet in Toronto for a grand review.

REGRETTED DEATH.

MONTREAL, July 4.—Rev. James Thornbee, father of the Bishop of Algoma, died at Lachine this morning, aged 86. He was for some time missionary at Georgetown, Que., and for a number of years rector of St. Luke's, Montreal.

DROWNED AT SEA.

An Albert County Man Loses His Life at Newport News, Va.

MONCTON, July 4.—Word has been received of the drowning at Newport News, Va., of Eugene McAuley, of Germantown, Albert Co. The deceased was twenty-two years of age and sailed on board the five masted schooner Maud Palmer of Dorchester.
