Canada's Credit Abroad.

Those Canadians who are proud of their country and who desire to see it stand well in the money markets of the world, will be pleased to hear that the new Canalian 31 per cent. Govern-ment stock, which was placed up n the London market a few months ago at 91, on the 11th inst. reached the high figure of 96, with the promise of attaining even a higher figure. This is a very satisfactory showing and speaks volumes, for the estimation in which Canada, is held by investors, who have not been deterred by the vigorous efforts that were made this year in certain quarters to decry her credit. It is evident that Canadian 31 per cent. stock will be at par before any very great laspe of time and that in the near future we may expect to float a 3 per cent. stock at a better price than was obtained for the 31 per cent. a few months ago. Indeed, considering the manner in which the Dominion has always met its obligations and the present tendency towards cheap money, there is no reason may stand at par before many years
