Our Wonderful Army.

How All The World Wars in France.

Never before in their lives have the French peasants had so marvellous an object lesson in "living geography" as now meets their eyes in their war-torn villages. There are black men and yellow men, red men and brown men, and white men.

Strange are the scenes around the camp fires at night, when the Scottish lads match their national dances with those of Moorish and Tunisian tribesmen and when the Cockney mouth organ vies with wild reeds and pipes of Pathan and Sikh, Garhwali and Gurkha.

Before the Front is reached, the Labour Battalions are to be seen. Here are Kafirs, Basutos and Chinese—the stalwart fellows who, in the critical hour, threw down their picks and shovels and took up rifles under General Carey to help stem a dangerous onrush of the Hunnish hordes.

Among the dock labourers and roadmakers are Red Indians from Ontario, Saskatchewan, and the Far West of the United States.

The French Colonial Army alone represents all the Moslem and Pagan races of Africa; there are Spahis and Zouaves from Algeria and Tunis, Moors and Berbers of the Great Atlas—men of magnificent physique and dash. There are tribesmen of the Niger and far Timbuctoo; coal-black giants from Senegal and the Congo, as well as very little slant-eyed fellows from Annam, Cambodia, and Indo-China.

Our own Army includes aboriginal Maoris of New Zealand; there are Dutch-speaking Boers in the South African contingent; and in the Canadian forces you will find Poles and Swedes, Russians and Red Indians. Well may the German Emperor bewail the "world of enemies" arrayed against him.

Imaginary Lines.

In President Wilson's "fourteen points" there is more than one reference to the restoration of frontiers.

We who know no other "frontier" than the sea scarcely realise what vague things the frontiers of other countries can be. It is possible in Europe to stand with the right foot in one country and the left foot in another.

We are all waiting the moment when the Allies step over the boundary into Germany. A few miles west of Metz, on the slopes that saw the hard fighting of the battle of Gravelotte in August, 1870, the frontier between France and Germany wriggles in a broken line across untenced fields. It is only marked here and there by posts.

A little beyond the frontier, on the German side, the Allies will find huge green mounds—the soldiers' graves of 1870.

One of the most remarkable boundaries in the world by the way, is that between Alaska and Canada. The line follows the meridian without the slightest deviation, regardless of mountains, swamps, and forests, and monuments, some of which are 5ft. shafts of aluminium-bronze, weighing 300lb., set in 2,000lb. of concrete, have been set up at points visible from each other over the whole 600 miles length of the boundary.
