



Unless special permission is obtained, all fire towers shall have no direct connection with the building but entrance to same must be gained by the use of outside balconics f similar design to warehouse fire escapes. Floors, landings, partitions, stairs, doors, and windows in fire towers must be strictly fireproof. All fire towers must be provided with ladder fire escapes, as called for in warchouses. Risers for fire tower stairs shall not exceed Sin. in height, un for stairs shall not be less than eight inches.

Provided, however, that if peri sion from the commissioner of build-ings is obtained, that schools and heatres may be provided with outside fire escapes instead of fire tower. The design of such fire escapes shall be subject to the approval of the deartment of buildings.

It will be observed by the hast ause that great power is placed in he hands of the building commismer or building inspector, as that fficial is termed in this city, giving him discretion in compelling the instalation of fire towers. This discretionary power, not only in the case of this clause, but of many others, will be met with serious objections on the part of several aldermen. While they do not dispute the wisdom of many Mr. Sylvester's recommendations, they hold that he is reserving entirely "Has the matter been determined too much power for his own department.




