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MUST HAVE MORE ROOM

To Accommodate New Pupils of the Collegiate Institute - Four Addi- tional Rooms Suggested.

The necessity of providing more room at the Collegiate Institute to meet the rapidly-growing attendance was brought to the attention of No. 2 Committee of the Education Board last evening. Principal Merchant stated that there was only room for 25 more pupils in the first form, and it was likely that 150 from the county would ask admission soon. They had to be accommo- dated or turned away. Mr. Merchant had inspected the building and suggested that the best plan would be to add four rooms to the front of the present building.

The city engineer, the principal and some of the board will look over the building, consider the recommendation and bring in an estimate of the cost.

As Inspector Seath recommended better gymnastic equipment information on the matter will be obtained. The principal and engineer will ascertain how much lighting red the institute requires. Seven new seats will be secured for Talbot street school. Arrangements will be made to clean the Smead-Dowd furnaces. Scrub- bing and grass-cutting was ordered at several schools. Trustees McElihan (chairman pro tem.), Craig, Anderson, Tanton, Dewar, Turner, D. W. Blackwell and Jeffrey and Principal Merchant and Secretary Abbott were present.
