Home Folks Think Pitt

Is Accident As Ball Player

TOLEDO, O., July 6.—It is as a basketball star rather than as a ball player that Pinkie Pittenger, the rising young infielder of the Boston Red Sox, is known in his home town here.

Pittenger never played important amateur baseball here and has not performed in front of the home folk since he broke into the professional game with the London, Ont., club two years ago.

But as a basketball forward Pittenger is an important figure not only in this district but throughout the middle west as well.

During the war he developed into the leading point-getter for the University of Toledo five that numbered among its victims the famous aggregation from the Great Lakes Naval Training Station. Pittenger never made much of a basketball player.

Manufacturers' Batting and Fielding

Twenty-six players in the Manufacturers' League during the first series hit within the charmed circle of 300, with Smith of the Grand Trunks the real leader, hitting 419 in 11 games, Steeper of Greene-Swifts next, hitting 400 in 10 games.
