KAMM'S BRILLIANT WORK CAUSES GIANTS' DOWNFALL

New York, April 13.—Due somewhat to the all-around brilliancy of Willie Kamm, the star brought from the Pacific coast, the Chicago White Sox took the lead from the New York Giants in their rambling spring series by winning yesterday's game at Johnson City, Tenn., 8 to 7. Kamm made four hits in four times at bat. The Sox have won seven of the last eight games.

The New York Yankees lost a whole bag of things at Springfield, Mo. They were defeated by Brooklyn, 3 to 7, and lost the immediate services of Everett Scott, the shortstop, who is nearing a record of 1,000 consecutive games. Scott injured his ankle when his spikes caught in the bag marking second base, and had to be carried from the field. This season's exhibition series between the two teams thus far stands with 7 wins and 5 losses for the American League.

POLICE COMMISSION TODAY.

Members of the police commission meet in special session this afternoon at 5:30 o'clock. "The meeting should be brief and snappy," predicts Mayor Wenig, chairman. "All we have on tap is O. K. the new 'seating capacity' clause in the omnibus by-law. This will allow the street railway to be operated, any other bus operator, to carry more passengers than he has seats for, providing no passenger registers objection."

His worship anticipates no opposition to the enactment.
