TOM WALSH ARRESTED
BY AUSTRALIAN POLICE
Heads of Seamen's Union Will
Be Deported From the
Commonwealth.

Associated Press Despatch.
Sydney, N. S. W., Nov. 20.—A sen-
tation was created here this morning
with the arrest of Tom Walsh, presi-
dent, and Jacob Johaneson, secre-
tary of the Australian seamen's
union, following a finding of the de-
portation board, appointed by the
Commonwealth government. Both
men are now held at Garden Island
naval depot in Sydney harbor, pen-
ing their shipment out of the coun-
try. Counsel for the two men has
applied to the supreme court for a
writ of habeas corpus.
Arrest of Walsh and Johaneson
was made at their homes at 5
o'clock this morning by Common-
wealth police. Both men were
prominently associated with the re-
cent strike of British seamen, and
have been fomenting industrial
trouble for many years. Their de-
portation was the most prominent
question before the country in the
recent federal elections. As a re-
sult of the vote Prime Minister Bruce
has acted quickly.
Destination of the deportees is un-
known. The government offers pas-
sages to the wives and children of
Walsh and Johaneson and susten-
ance. Walsh married Adella Pank-
hurst, and has a family of six chil-
dren.
After President Tom Walsh and
Secretary Jacob Johaneson, of the
Australian Seamen's Union, had been
arrested and taken to Garden Island,
an application on behalf of both men
was made in court here for a writ of
habeas corpus, which was granted.
The writ of habeas corpus calls upon
the commonwealth police superintendent
to show cause why he should not
produce Walsh and Johaneson in
court and why they should not be
released from custody.

PREMIER BRUCE YEATS.
Melbourne, Australia, Nov. 20.—
Premier S. M. Bruce, referring to the
arrest of Tom Walsh and Jacob
Johaneson, respectively president
and secretary of the Australian Sea-
men's Union, in Sydney today, with
a view to their deportation, stated
that both of the accused were con-
cerned in acts directed at hindering
and obstructing the transport of
goods and passengers in relation to
trade with other countries and that
their presence in Australia was in-
jurious to peace and order. Further-
more, the premier said they had
acted to show cause why they should
not be deported.

TEN KILLED IN ATTACK.
Beirut, Syria, Nov. 20.—Ten sol-
diers and civilians were killed or
wounded when an auto bus proceed-
ing from Beirut to Damascus was at-
tacked a few miles northeast of the
latter city. The attack occurred in
the region where the Druse tribes-
men are endeavoring to induce the
inhabitants of the various villages to
rise against the French.
