

A Marquis in Trouble.

The Marquis of Westmeath has a friend, a 'leading Orangeman,' who frequents the strangers' gallery of the House of Lords, which is immediately above the gallery in which the reporters sit. On the occasion of the second reading of the Bill for the repeal of the Declaration against Transubstantiation, Lord Westmeath had given notice of a question, and was about to speak, when his leading Orange friend, whose name is Harper, being in the gallery, overheard one reporter say to another, 'I see that d-d old idiot, the Marquis of Westmeath has a long notice on the books for this evening, but I'll take care not to give a word of what he says.'
