The corn sales to Europe are also very large, and the facts in regard to this cereal are in our judgment distinctly bullish. Oats will follow other grain. We favor purchases on the declines and sales on the advances.

Corn—The heavy movement that is looked for in the near future, when the weather becomes be rable for outdoor work, has created quite a bearish feeling in corn. There is a good demand at the sea-board, but corn is not obtainable except at higher relative prices than will prevail when navigation opens. This causes an accumulation at primary points, and is rather a bearish feature, but the market has shown a good deal of strength lately.

Provisions—The export demand for lard and meat is improving. Lie consumption of provisions is very heavy throughout the country and indeed throughout the world. Prices are comparatively low, hogs and grain have risen, labor is everywhere employed, the tendency is towards a broad speculative trade, the consumption will probably surposs all previous records, and we believe

the tendency of prices is upward.
