And we are obliged even to blot out that historical chivalric visit to the army of Til bury; not that the Queen was wanting in the personal valour of her race, by any means; but for the simple reason that there being then no army at Tilbury to visit, the celebrated occurrence did not take place till after the Armada had disappeared from the scene. Had she gone before, the famous Governor of Tilbury Fort might have said as truly of the British Army as he did of the Spanish Fleet; "the British force thou canet not see—because there's none in sight."
