NEWS IN BRIEF.

EUROPEAN. Smallpox is raging in St. Petersburg and ten per cent. of the victims die.

Four persons were killed in a powder explosion near Belfort, France, Friday.

A strike has occurred at Lord Londonderry's coal mines in Durham. Two thousand five hundred men are on strike.

Lady Rosebery died in Paris last week. She was the daughter of the late Baron Meyer de Rothschild and the wife of Lord Rosebery.

Two cashiers of a Warsaw bank, who were travelling to Berlin, were found murdered on the Vienna mail train on Friday. They had 55,000 rubles in their possession.

The Aborigines Protection Society of Great Britain is considering the question whether to train, ward and employ the children of the Sudanese burglars.

The financial situation in London has decidedly improved and confidence is largely restored. In America the most disturbing incident has been the failure of the banking firm of Barker Bros. & Co. of Philadelphia.

Mr. Sandford Fleming has received information that the 24-hour notation, introduced by himself, has been adopted on all the railways of Canada.

Monks of the Nihilist who had several interviews with Padlewski, the Russian Pole who is suspected of the murder of General Skobeleff, prior to Padlewski's disappearance from Paris, and who, it is known, furnished him with money, has been expelled from France.

Emperor William, in an address to some recently recruited guardsmen at Berlin, said that although peace reigned without the empire that could only be overcome by the principles of Christianity.

The New York state annual will be closed on November 30.

P. W. Galland, of New York, has suspended. Liabilities \$1,000,000.

Cincinnati is excited over a report that a southerner was planning to assassinate President Harrison after the Gaitheau fashion.

The drivers and laborers in the Block coal mines, Indiana, have struck for an increase in wages. Two thousand miners are thrown out of employment by the strike.

Five children who attended a west end school in Toronto have died of diphtheria.

The execution of Morin, convicted of murder at Montserrat, Quebec, has been postponed to December 19.

Mr. R. M. Meredith, of London, was sworn in at Saratoga by Judge Bayd as judge of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

A resolution introduced in the York, Ontario, County Council looking to the formation of a new county out of the townships in the northern part of York County was defeated.

A board of trade has been organized at Oshawa, Ont., with the following officers: Melvin Miller, president; Frank Knox, vice-president; George Thomson, treasurer; C. W. Lawson, secretary.

Mr. P. Laberge, of Quebec, has been appointed to be assistant postmaster of the city of Quebec, and Arsene Cyr Miquelon, of Sherbrooke, Quebec, has been made assistant postmaster of Sherbrooke.

In the case of Mr. Bird of Newfoundland against Sir Baldwin Walker, the British law officers have abandoned their plea in defence that Capt. Walker was executing the Treaty of Versailles when he closed up the lobster factory.

A new order was put into effect this week at Windsor by the United States customs officers preventing those living in Canada from taking musical instruments into the United States unless the duty is paid. Some time ago the Canadian authorities had an order compelling American citizens to pay duty on their instruments before they could play in Canada.

The new steamer Boston has not yet arrived at Halifax and nothing has been heard of her. She is now fifteen days out from Glasgow, and serious fears are felt for her safety. She is reported to have only had three hundred and forty tons of coal on board, and it is thought that she was compelled to burn up this during the hurricane that prevailed, and she is now helplessly drifting about at sea without fuel.
