Market Situation and Outlook

- Total imports of redfish in 1992 amounted to 59,931 metric tons. As the inventory carried over from 1991 to 1992 was 15,000 metric tons, the total supply in 1992 was approximately 75,000 metric tons.
- As the Japanese annual demand for redfish for both processing and retail sales in thawed form is approximately 40,000 metric tons, as much as 35,000 metric tons are said to have been carried over from 1992 to 1993.
- The market for redfish softened in 1992 due to increased imports. The low price of redfish <u>kirimi</u> (slices) has made some kirimi processors withdraw from processing redfish as a result of the labour shortage still seen in 1992.
- While imports from Norway decreased significantly in 1992, imports from Canada, Iceland, Russia, Estonia, Latvia, and the USA increased noticeably.
