On motion of Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), the said Report was concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), it was resolved, That the Select Standing Committees of this House shall severally be empowered to examine and inquire into all such matters and things as may be referred to them by the House, and to report from time to time their observations and opinions thereon; with power to send for persons, papers and records.

Mr. Ladner, seconded by Mr. Black (Yukon), by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 16, An Act to amend and make operative certain provisions of the Copyright Act, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 15, An Act to amend the Export Act, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The House went into Committee of the Whole to consider a proposed Resolution in respect to the transfer of the Natural Resources of Alberta.

The following Resolution was adopted:—

Resolved, That it is expedient to bring in a measure to confirm the agreement between the Governments of the Dominion and the Province of Alberta, dated 14th December, 1929, respecting the transfer of the Natural Resources of Alberta.
