PRAYERS.

The Honourable Mr. Watson, from the Standing Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbours, to whom was referred the Bill 24, "An Act respecting The Toronto, Niagara and Western Railway Company," reported that they had gone through the said Bill and had directed him to report the same to the Senate, without any amendment.

Ordered, That the said Bill be placed on the Orders of the Day for a Third Reading to-morrow.

On motion, it was Ordered, That the fee paid upon the Petition of Rodolf Volhoffer, praying for a Bill of Divorce, be refunded to the Petitioner, less the cost of printing and translation.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill 8, "An Act respecting The Niagara, St. Catharines and Toronto Railway Company," was read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Senate proceeded to the consideration of the Message from the House of Commons disagreeing to the amendment made by the Senate to Bill 91, "An Act to amend The Government Railways Small Claims Act."

Ordered, That the Senate do not insist on their Amendment to the said Bill; and that the Clerk do carry a Message to the House of Commons accordingly.
