CAPE BRETON—EXPENDITURES FOR IMPROVEMENT OF COAL MINES

Question No. 1,843—Mr. Douglas:

1. What were the total expenditures by the Cape Breton Development Corporation for the improvement of coal mines in Cape Breton?

2. What amount has been spent per mine or pit since the commencement of this programme?

Hon. Jean Marchand (Minister of Regional Economic Expansion): 1. Expenditures to December 31, 1970, were \$13,650,000.

2. Of this, \$6,888,000 was spent on four existing mines, \$4,527,000 for coke ovens, and \$2,220,000 towards the development of the new Lingan mine.

Mr. J. A. Jerome (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): I am informed by the Department of Agriculture and the National Research Council as follows: 1. (a) \$49,587,000; (b) 1970-71, \$1,218,000; 1971-72, \$1,115,000 (estimated).

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2. The government has on a number of occasions informed France of the jurisdiction of the federal government in the area of satellite communications and of Canada's desire for mutually advantageous cooperation in space communications generally.

3. The government has not been informed of the participation of any province in the construction or use of the Symphonie system. Information has, however, been forwarded last July by the Department of Communications of Quebec to my department indicating that the government of that province is studying the possibilities of making use of the satellite.

4. Yes.

5. I have been informed by Telesat Canada that there have been no discussions between officials of that corporation and the Government of Quebec in that connection. There have been informal exchanges between officials of the Department of Communications and Quebec.
