With respect to the Financial Administration Act, Section 88 and 89, for each fiscal year since April 1, 1985, has Transport Canada collected data on (a) the number of train kilometres travelled on each VIA service provided, per route, per year (b) the number of passengers carried on each VIA service, and total number of passenger kilometres travelled on each VIA service, and total number of seat kilometres on each VIA service, per route, per year (c) the amount of total revenues from each VIA service, per route, per year (d) the total of avoidable costs of each VIA service, per route, per year and, if so, for each case, what is it?
