February 26—That an Order of the Senate do issue for a statement showing the cost of enforcing of the National Service Act, of the Military Service Act, and of the Order in Council establishing the Canada Registration Board.

No. 2.

By the Honourable Mr. David:—

February 26—That an Order of the Senate do issue showing the number of Canadian officers and soldiers who left Canada since the beginning of the war, the time of their residence in England and France, the cost of their maintenance in those countries, the number of those who never went to the front, and the names of such officers.

No. 3.

By the Honourable Sir James Lougheed, K.C.M.G.:—

February 25.—That the Senate of Canada accepts with sincere gratitude the Black Rod presented to it by the United Kingdom Branch of the Empire Parliamentary Association, recognizing the gift as an expression of the good feelings of the members of the Mother of Parliaments towards their colleagues in the Parliamest of Canada and as a token of appreciation of their common efforts in the momentous events of the past few years.
