In the 6 and 7 group, Danielle Norman won the girls event, followed by Trina Telford and Kyna Boyce, while Michael Allen won the boys event followed by Nathan Pierce and Dean Kerr.

Brothers Dwayne and Shane Nicol won the egg tossing contest after a long struggle with the team of Wayne Pierce and Jason Schoenfeld who placed second.

In the men's chainsaw events, Bob Crummy won the small saw event followed by Jim Barton. Brian Telford won the medium saw event, while the large saw competition was won by Barry Bartholomew followed by Neil Bartholomew. Brian Telford was declared the overall event winner.
