

The water in James Bay in the vicinity of the mouth of Moose River is somewhat turbid and slightly brackish.
The rise and fall at spring tides is about ten feet; at neaps about six feet.

High water at full and change of moon $1\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock.

Sea going ships come to the Inner Ship Hole from the direction of St. B's elsewhere the water is shallow with sand and mud bottom.

The dotted line from the Inner Ship Hole indicates the channel followed by schooners to Moose Factory.

The head of tidewater is about eight miles above Moose Factory or twenty miles from the sea:

The continuous shore lines indicate the ordinary high tide mark. Extraordinary high tides occasionally flood back to the line of bushes.
