Up to March last, my Sunday services were divided between St. Paul's, Marbleton, the Good Shepherd, Dudswell Corner, and St. Thomas', Westbury. Since then the services at the last mentioned Church have been supplied by the Rev. Professor Roe and Divinity students. This arrangement has enabled me to concentrate my work nearer home, giving to St. Paul's morning and evening services, and to the Good Shepherd my afternoons with aid in the Sunday schools at both Churches. The congregations have been good. The only material improvements undertaken during the year have been the ornamental planting and fencing of the Church yard and burial ground, and the purchase of a very fine-toned bell, weighing 625 lbs., for the Church of the Good Shepherd. Such a bell is a credit to either town or country. Chandeliers for the more efficient lighting of St. Paul's have been procured. Christmas trees for the children of both congregations have been provided.
