

or delegacy to some discreet and well learned person of this Land of Ireland, or else in the Realm of England, for final determination of all Causes and Grievs in said Appeals, &c.

28 Hen. VIII. Cap. 14. “ *An Act for the twentieth part*” enacts “ that the King’s
 “ Majesty, his heirs and successors, Kings
 “ of the realm of England, for more augmentation and maintenance of the Royal
 “ Estate of his Imperial Crown, and dignity of supreme head of the Church of
 “ England and of Ireland, shall yearly have,
 “ take, enjoy and receive, united and knit
 “ to his Imperial Crown for ever, one yearly rent or pension,” &c.

N. B. At the time of passing this last mentioned Act, King Henry VIII. was stiled LORD and *not* KING of IRELAND—the Grant was therefore to him, merely as KING OF ENGLAND, and annexed to the Imperial Crown of *that realm*.
