or delegacy to fome difcreet and well learned perfon of this Land of Ireland, or elfe in the Realm of England, for final determination of all Caufes and Griefs in faid Appeals, &c.

28 Hen. VIII. Cap. 14. "An Act for the twentieth part" enacts "that the King's "Majefty, his heirs and fucceffors, Kings "of the realm of England, for more aug-"mentation and maintenance of the Royal "Eftate of his Imperial Crown, and dig-"nity of fupreme head of the Church of "England and of Ireland, fhall yearly have, "take, enjoy and receive, united and knit "to his Imperial Crown for ever, one year-"ly rent or penfion," &c.

N. B. At the time of paffing this laft mentioned Act, King Henry VIII. was ftiled LORD and not KING of IRELAND—the Grant was therefore to him, merely as KING OF ENGLAND, and annexed to the Imperial Crown of *that realm*.
