NOTE.—The army in Great Britain, and the navy, merchant seamen, and other persons on board vessels in the ports are included in the return for 1851; the army, merchant seamen, and persons on board vessels were not included in 1841. The apparent decrease of houses in Scotland, between 1841 and 1851, is attributable to the fact that in 1841, flats or stories were reckoned in many places as "houses;" in the present census the more correct definition has been employed.

NOTE.—The Army serving in Ireland is not included in the returns. The Census of 1851 having been taken 65 days earlier than that of 1841 there should be 5,841 persons added to the gross population of 1841, harvest labourers, ascertained to have left Ireland previous to 7th June, 1841.

The Population in 1821 was 8,211,277; in 1831, 7,767,401; in 1841, 9,173,124; in 1851, 8,515,791.
