PLATE GLASS, FAVORITE SECOND IN HANDICAP

Jawbone and Superintendent Win the Feature Races at Saratoga.

SARATOGA, Aug. 25.—Superintendent F. Mannix's gelding, with sutwell up, won the Troy Selling Stakes today; but, as it cost the owner \$1000 to retain him, it was not a profitable race. The race was a rough one from the start, but Superintendent managed to get his mount in front on entering the stretch, and gradually pulled out. Delft, after being badly knocked about, came strong in the final quarter. Plate Glass, the favorite for the handicap, had to lower his colors to Talbot's Jawbone, ridden by J. McTaggart. The same jockey piloted Ella Bryson to victory in the fifth race.

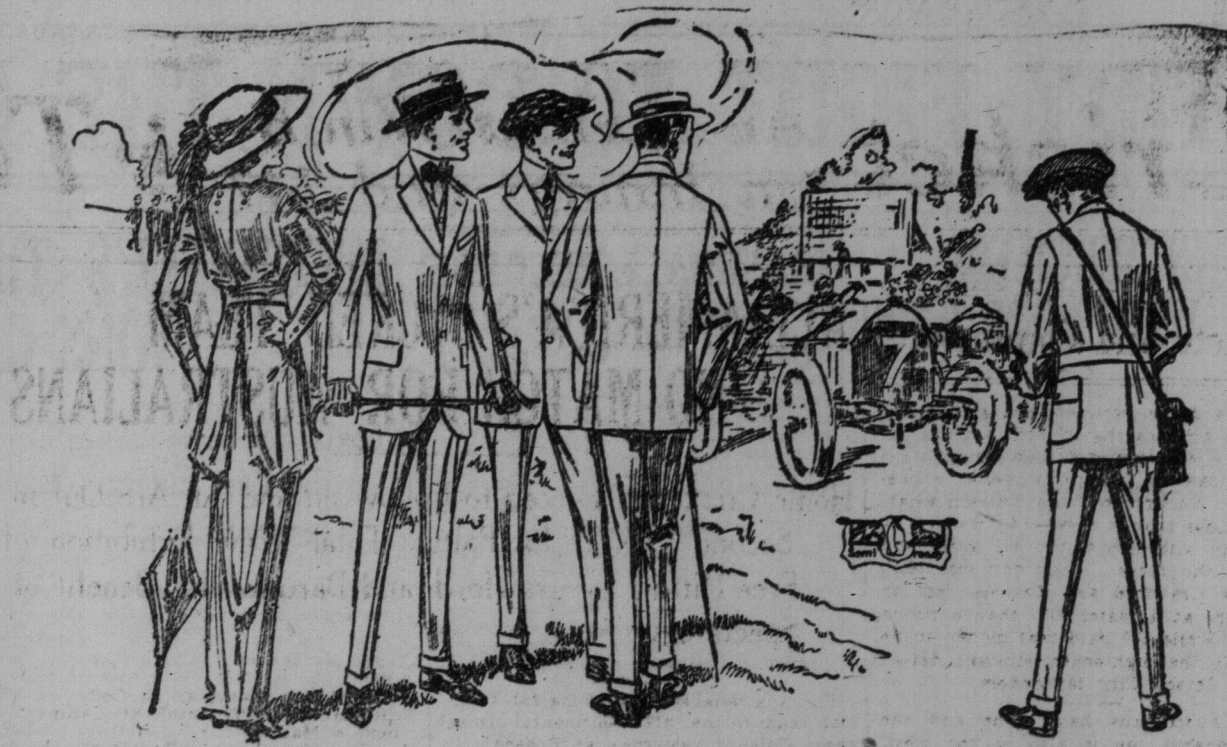
