MONTREAL, Aug. 20.—There was no further change in the condition of the local grain market today, being very firm with fair trade passing in car lots. The demand from London for oats is good and as high as 23c was bid for No. 2 Canadian western. The enquiry from the United Kingdom for spring wheat flour today was fair, but there were no firm bids and millers state that they are not in a position to make any offers at present. The local trade is active at firm prices. Demand for mill feed is good, and offerings are rather scarce. Old crop baled hay is in good demand at strong prices. The trade in butter is rather quiet, but there is more demand for cheese, and some round lots have been sold over the cable, which has tended to strengthen the market in the country and prices have advanced. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$30.00 per acre.
