

about \$5.60 and lambs \$4.50 for good qualities. Hogs are quiet, with a sale of sixteen head at 5c per lb. Calves dull and nominal at \$5 to \$15 each, according to size and condition.

Provisions.—Butter.—There is little or nothing doing in exporting, there being but little demand; choice selections are steady at 17c to 18c. The movement in the city shows a slight improvement, with choice dairy worth 20c to 21c. Inferior qualities bring 15c to 18c. Bacon is quiet at 8½c for long clear and 7½c for Cumberland cut. Ham is moving slowly without change in price, 10½c for smoked. Pork quiet at \$16. Lard is in moderate demand and steady at 10½c to 11c for Canadian and 13c for American. Cheese has slightly improved and steady at 13c to 14c. Dried Apples are unchanged at 3½c to 4c for loose lots, and 4c to 4½c for selected in barrels.

SEEDS.—In Clover there has been a freer movement, with some street lots taken at \$4.80 to \$5. It is said that two cars of choice reseeded seed sold at \$5.15 to \$5.20, but was of an exceptionally fine quality. Timothy is firm at \$4.50 to \$5 per cental, and Flax at \$3 per cental.

Wool.—Trade has ruled quiet the past week, and offerings small. Dealers are paying 30c for ordinary qualities of fleece and 30½c for choice. Pulled wools are steady at 30c to 31c for supers and 35c to 36½c for extra.
