The largest gathering of cricketers ever held in Toronto was held at St. James' parish house last night to decide what they should do in support of the Sportsmen's Association.

W. Paris, captain of Grace Church Club, was voted to the chair, and H. G. Greer, K.C., president of the association, set forth the objects of the organization in a lengthy and interesting address, receiving at its conclusion a most hearty vote of thanks for his attendance.

Then the meeting got down to business and numerous suggestions were made as to the best way in which the cricketers, who have sent 200 men to the front, could help the funds of the association.

It was decided that each club should open a subscription list among its own members, the amount collected to be returned on Sept. 4.

A subscription cricket match, to be played as soon after Labor Day as possible, will be played at Varsity Campus, and the executive committee was instructed to procure the two strongest possible eleven representing either the city and C. & M. Leagues, or All-East V. All-West Toronto.

The committee was elected as follows: Chairman, E. S. Jackson; Messrs. W. Foster, T. P. Wood, E. Blackwell, Sampson, W. Paris and H. Blackwell.

The proceedings through were most enthusiastic, with the exception of the Rosedale and Toronto, every club in the city was largely represented.
