Labousimere has established a checse factory at St. Leon, Man.
Chas. I. Shaw and A. Prince, of Edmonton, have formed a law partnership.
H. F. Holmes, hardware dealer, Rat l'ortage, tas opened a branch at Keewatin.
The woolen mill at Kapid City will be com. pleted toward the close of next month.
H. W. Clank, merchant, Strathelair, Man., has considerably enlarged his premises.
Jons O'Nrils, stoves and tins, Broadview, Assa., has added grocerics to his business.
The Massey Manufacturing Company have erected an implement warehouse at Shoal Lake, Man.
Alex. Mcistyre, liquor dealer, Wimipeg and Brandon, is closing his branch at the latter place.
J. St. G. Jellett has retired from the store lusiness at Clover Bar, Edmonton District, Alberta.

Work will shortly be commenced on the 1,000-barrel flour mill and clevator, to be built at Keewatin.

A 30,000 -nusurl elevator will be erected in connection with the new flour mill at Rapid City, Man.

Alex. Stuart has been engaged by the Manitoba Govermment as chief engineer for the construction of the proposed railway from Winnipeg to the boundary.
Jos. Huxisir, representing Lightbound, Ralston \& Co., wholesale grocers, of Montreal, started for home last week, nfter having a successful trip of several weeks in Manitoba.

A glunsd anti-disallowance mass meeting will be held in Wimipeg on Wednesday evening next. The reeves of all municipalities in the province have been invited to attend. Tho delegates who recently visited Ottawa will give a full report of their doings and the result of their mission.

The: Dominion Government intend rebuilding the immigration shels in Winnipeg and tho work will be commenced in the course of a week. Temporary accommodation has been secured for immigrants in the building near the C.P.R. freight sheds, formerly used as the north eud police station. A Dominion Intelligence office has been located at the store, 713 Main street.
A deretatios consisting of Messrs. Whitla, Ashdown, Galt, Redmond and Bertrand waited on the Govermment Tuesilay morning, regarding amendments proposed to the Assignment Act. The deputation urged that instead of ap. pointing a different assignec for every insolvent estate, one regular assignee should be appointed to take charge of ail insolvent cstates, the appointec to be nominated by the board of trade and the appointment confirmed by the Government. The gentlemen also urged that the time between an assignment and the calling of a meeting of the creditors should be shortencd. The deputation was also desirons that the assignec should not be allowed to incur any expendituro until the mecting of the creditors and until he was authorized to do so. Satis. factory replies were given to tho deputation and the Government promised to make a now draft of proposed amendments and submit it to the board before passing it through the Houso
