TO SUM UP.

Industrials insured of stability must reorganize their manufacturing establishments, mills and shops on the latest improvements, regulating their production according to the demand and supply on a more rational and economical basis, open out new branches of industry, for which with a fair assurance of success capital will not be lacking.

Merchants must take a firm stand to abolish the pernicious credit system. Farmers and agriculturalists must give their soil, in the shape of fertilizers, what they take from it, and rich crops will soon repay them for the outlay.

Let every one, Government and individuals, put their hands energetically to the wheel and we shall
