

## SECT. II.

## Specimens of Syntactical Parsing.

Vice degrades us.

*Vice* is a common substantive, of the neuter gender, the third person, in the singular number, and the nominative case. *Degrades* is a regular verb active, indicative mood, present tense, third person singular agreeing with its nominative "*Vice*," according to *Rule* I. which says; (here repeat the rule.) *Us* is a personal pronoun, first person plural, in the objective case, and governed by the active verb "*degrades*," agreeable to *Rule* XI. which says, &c.

He who lives virtuously prepares for all events.

*He* is a personal pronoun, of the third person, singular number, and masculine gender. *Who* is a relative pronoun, which has for its antecedent "*he*," with which it agrees in gender and number, according to *Rule* V. which says, &c. *Lives* is a regular verb neuter, indicative mood, present tense, third person singular, agreeing with its nominative, "*who*," according to *Rule* VI. which says, &c. *Virtuously* is an adverb of quality. *Prepares* a regular verb neuter, indicative mood, present tense, third person singular, agreeing with its nominative, "*he*." *For* is a preposition. *All* is an adjective pronoun, of the indefinite kind, the plural number, and belongs to its substantive, "*events*," with which it agrees, according to *Rule*
