LINER PLOWED INTO IMMENSE FIELD OF ICE

Steamship Shenandoah in Perilous Position—Had to Lay To All Night.

HALIFAX, March 6.—The steamship Shenandoah arrived yesterday from London via St. John's, Nfld., after encountering one of the greatest fields of ice that ever floated on the Atlantic. The Shenandoah left London on Thursday, Feb. 16. Heavy northwest and westerly gales prevailed until she arrived at St. John's on Monday, Feb. 27, when 260 miles east of Newfoundland this afternoon, she plowed into a tremendous field of ice, in which were eight huge bergs. So perilous was her position that it was necessary to lay to all night.
