What Does "Negotiating" Mean With Banks?

Section 74 of the Bank Act allows a bank to lend money to anyone in the wholesale business upon the security of goods provided by him, but the bank must not receive such security to secure the payment of a bill or note, unless such bill or note is "negotiated" at the time the bank acquires it.

Tuesday Evening, Oct. 6. Dec. wheat on curb 60c. Put on Dec. wheat 67 1/2c, calls 70 1/2c. Put on May corn 29 1/2c, calls 29 1/2c. At Toledo crop sold closed at 52.25 for Oct.

Receipts of wheat at Liverpool the past three days were 83,000 tons, including 64,000 tons of American. Corn, same time, 15,800 tons.

Exports at New York today: Flour 8,000 tons, wheat 13,747 sacks, wheat 140,000 bushels.
