Port Arthur, Jan. 3.-(Special.)-The Jennison bylaw, which is to enable the council to execute the contract to pay Jencil to execute the contract to pay sen-nison and his associates \$10,000 per annum for 40 years for 750 electrical horse power and 250,000,000 gallons of water per annum, was chried by 175 majority. Jennison pro-poses to spend \$1,000,000 to build a canal from Kakabeka Falls to Part Arthur. This canal will develop 20,000 horse power, and have a head of water at Port Arthur of 500 feet for power, light, water and heat burposes.

ly Will Not Sell Delagon Bay. Lisbon, Jan. 3.-King Charles opened the two legislative chambers yesterday. Dur-ing the course of his speech from the throne, His Majesty said he greatly sym-pathized with the Czar's disarmament pro-posals, and made a reference to the colo-nies which apparently disposes of the ru-mors of the sale of Delagoa Bay. He said: "It is not sufficient to preserve our colo-mied domains in their complete integrity as the sacred heritage of the nation, but they must be developed as the solid basis of our economic regeneration."
