Montreal, May 26.—(Special).—Mr. W. J. Maguire of the Quebec Mercury, who has recently returned from a trip to Rome, gave some impressions to-day as to what he learned to be the feelings of many of the members of the Papal household in regard to Canadian political affairs.

What the Liberals Promised. The statement was made at the Vatican that the present Government had virtually promised that it would secure for the majority of the Prairie Province a full and further measure of justice, in keeping with the judgment of the Privy Council, if it was returned to power again.

Confidence in Laurier. According to Mr. McGuire, the feeling of the Vatican is one of confidence in respect to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and he asserts that the firm belief is held there that Sir Wilfrid and Mr. C. G. D. Fryer will yet act in a manner that will legally restore separate schools in Manitoba.

A Papal Ablegate to Come. Finally, Mr. McGuire thinks that a member of the Laurier cabinet is shortly to visit Rome about this question. He also thinks that the people of Canada need not be surprised if the Vatican in the near future to appoint a papal ablegate to Canada.

CHINA PREPARING TO FIGHT

DEATH OF THE ALASKA BOUNDARY

London Foreign Office Officials Are Rather Discouraged Over the Outlook.

THE SITUATION REGRETTED.

But Canadians Should Not Yield to Sentiment, Says The Londop Globe.

U. S. INCLINED TO RETALIATE.

Treasury Department Has Two Courses Open—One is to Further Increase the Lumber Duty.

London, May 26.—The Foreign Office officials confirm the statements made by the New York correspondent of The London Times to the effect that the negotiations with the Canadian Government on the subject of Alaska have reached an almost hopeless stage, owing to the insistence of the Canadian side that they receive a slice of Alaska, which apparently precludes any agreement being reached on the subject between the American and Canadian High Commissioners.

Canadian Should Not Yield. The Globe says: "The Canadians would be far less patriotic than they are if they yielded to what they consider to be an unjust and undefensible demand for the sake of the establishment of more friendly relations with our big neighbor."

American Politics in It. The St. James Gazette thinks American politics are playing an important part in the situation, and says: "The Republicans are disposed to a friendly arrangement with England, but it must be on terms favorable to America that the Democrats will have no excuse to say they yielded their interests to Great Britain."

Inclined to Retaliate. United States Government is Disposed to Show Ugliness Towards Canada in the Matter.

Washington, May 26.—There is little doubt that the United States Government is inclined to retaliatory considerations against Canada by the discouraging results of the negotiations in London, looking to the clearing of the field for the reassembling of the Joint Canadian Commission. It is gathered that the British Foreign Office, which had seemed desirous to meet Mr. Chamberlain in the spirit of compromise that promised well, has been again induced to change its attitude, and to agree to anything less than a concession of all their demands, which has stopped all progress.

The Department of State has referred to the Treasury Department the arrangement of a plan to protect the interests of the United States.
