Herbert, the absconding teller, had been arrested and was at the Central Station. It appears that Herbert had been hiding in a house on Arcadestreet since 'July last, and had been aided by a man named O'Brien. Detectives Carpenter and Mc-Caskill went to the house yesterday and the bird had flown, but O'Brien was traced to a second house in St. Antoine-street west, near Atwater-avenue, and there the exteller was apprehended at an early hour this morning. Herbert did not resist, and appeared to be glad it was over.

The Banque Villie Marie closed its doors on the 25th of July last. Immediately after that event the president, in making his statement about the affairs of the bank, charged Herbert with being a defaulter to the extent of \$58,000, and Ferdinand Lemieux, the chief accountant, with being an accomplice.
