### WHEAT STUMPS FOUR CENTS

Continuation of the Reaction Started on Monday.

Cables Were Weak and Nervous. Holders Liquidated Freely. Corn Was a Strong Feature - Local Grain, Fruit, Produce and Live Stock - Notes and Gossip of a Day.

**World Office.** Tuesday Evening, June 26. The transatlantic wheat market cannot be said to have recovered from the reaction started on Monday. In Liverpool spot wheat closed at 1.10 per cental below yesterday's final figure. Liverpool market futures declined 1/4 to 3/8 cental, and flour 10 to 20 centimes.

Chicago wheat futures slipped 1/4 to 1/2 cent per bushel and closed at the low point of the day. The decline was on weaker cables, good winter crop news from Kansas and southern in general. Chicago coats was heavy early in sympathy with wheat, but recovered on word of wet weather in growing wheat.
