This statement of receipts and expenditure shows the very gratifying fact that the total receipts of 1884 exceeded the whole expenditure of the year by the sum of \$55.54. Nor is this favourable balance secured by ignoring or with holding accounts ; for except one, amounting to \$84.00, no single unpaid account is now in the Treasurer's hands, nor is anything known to the Treasurer to be due by your Committee except the cost of the double windows, finished in December last, and it was understood that this amount might remain unpaid for some time.

Another encouraging feature shown by this synopsis of the year's receipts and expenditure, is that from what may be call the permanent sources of our revenue, there has been an increase in all, except one, over the corresponding items of last year.
