SENATORS RAISE PROTEST AGAINST JEWELRY BILL. Kerr and Gibson Say Amendment to Act is in Restraint of Trade.

OTTAWA, June 23.—In the senate today Senator Ferguson asked if an ad hoc judge had been appointed to relieve Judge Cassels of his exchequer court when he was investigating the marine department. Hon. R. W. Scott stated that the minister of justice had given him to understand that the law was not broad enough for the appointment of an ad hoc judge.

In committee on a bill respecting the Gold and Silver Marks Act, which proposes to at once apply the provision which allows jewelry to be brought into Canada or made in Canada and called gold below nine carats, and an article shall not be called silver or sterling unless 975 parts pure silver. Senator Kerr declared this the most drastic piece of protective legislation which had ever been introduced into the Canadian Parliament and he protested against it. It was a new departure in protective legislation.
