That, when the House adjourns following the disposal of the third reading and passage stage of Bill C-24, respecting immigration to Canada, it shall stand adjourned until August 4, 1977 and, when it adjourns on August 5, 1977, it shall stand adjourned until October 17, 1977, provided that at any time prior to that date if it appears to the satisfaction of Mr. Speaker, after consultation with the government, that the public interest requires that the House should meet at an earlier time during the adjournment, Mr. Speaker may give notice that he is so satisfied, and thereupon the House shall meet at the time stated in such notice, and shall transact its business as if it had been duly adjourned to that time; and

That, in the event of Mr. Speaker's being unable to act owing to illness or other cause, the Deputy Speaker or the Deputy Chairman of Committees shall act in his stead for the purpose of reconvening the House.
