LONG LAKE OR KEEHEWIN'S

The population of this reserve is 175, with an area of 18,000 acres, consisting of mostly park land. No heavy timber is to be found but there is an abundance of light poplar and willows. Parts of it are quite stony but there is plenty of good land for farming purposes. The number of acres of crop this year are as follows: 400 acres seeded to wheat and oats, 17 acres to gardens, 110 acres to be broken, and 115 acres to summerfallow. Therefor by fall they should have about 650 acres under cultivation. There is a tractor on this reserve owned by the band.
