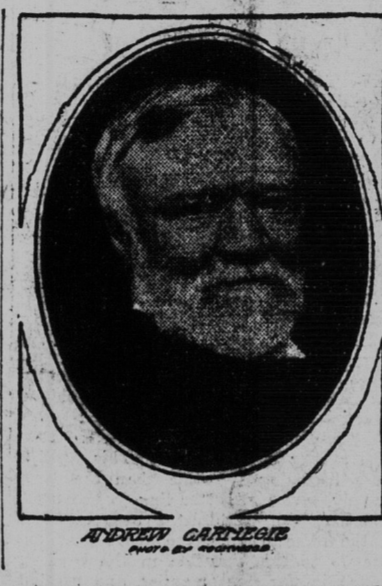

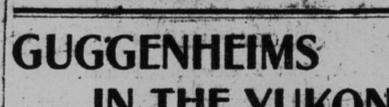

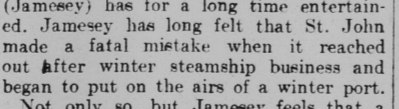
POLICE COURT
