ATROCITIES IN BELGRADE

EQUALED THOSE IN BELGIUM

Parties of German Soldiers Detailed to Complete Work of Exterminating Serbs Left in the City

London, Nov. 5.—Details of German atrocities after the taking of Belgrade are beginning to come in. The Serbian Archimandrite Michew has received from Prof. Svecanovitch, a well known Serbian, a letter describing the first three days of the German occupation. He says that every one was massacred without regard to age or sex—the children, women and old men were shot down or stabbed by bayonet or sword. A certain number of soldiers were sent out in parties to complete the work of extermination of Serbs left in the city, after native troops were forced to withdraw. From his letter the scenes were worse than in Belgium in the early days of the war.

TWO MANY CASES OF WIFE DESERTION HERE

Annual Meeting of Associated Charities Discusses Bad Housing Conditions in North End

At the annual meeting of the Associated Charities, held last evening in the Board of Trade rooms, the secretary drew attention to the large number of cases of wife desertion during the year. Another matter which engaged the attention of the meeting was the unsatisfactory housing conditions in some parts of the North End, and a committee was appointed to act with a Board of Trade committee in seeking improvements.

The president, W. S. Fisher, urged a campaign to increase the number of dollar subscriptions to increase the interest in the work as well as for the sake of the revenue.

Rev. Ralph Sherman gave an address on charitable work in the east end of London.

A. M. Belding spoke of the valuable work which has been accomplished by the Children's Aid Society, particularly since the appointment of Mr. Howard as director.

Rev. Dr. Hutchinson spoke on conditions in the North End, with particular reference to undesirable housing.

C. D. Howard, of the Children's Aid Society, gave an instructive talk on how he supported the statement of Dr. Barker that there are too many "shell-holes" in St. John.

The financial report showed that the year started with a cash balance of \$460. The receipts were \$746, and the expenditures \$678.

The secretary, Miss Grace O. Robertson, gave details of a large amount of useful work accomplished.

PRESIDENT WILSON'S CAMPAIGN FOR NATIONAL DEFENCE

President Wilson opened his campaign for the administration's defence programme yesterday with an address delivered at the annual banquet of the Manhattan Club in New York. He said that the United States must be prepared to defend itself to assume full liberty and self development and called on all citizens to support the policy. The defence programme includes an increase in the standing army, the training within the next three years of 400,000 citizen soldiers, the strengthening of the national guard and an increase in the strength of the navy with an adequate supply of men and equipment.
