

URGES GRAPE JUICE FOR COMMUNION

Los Angeles Diocese Presents
Petition Through Bishop at
Episcopal Convention—Is
Called Prohibition Move.

A petition was presented to the House of Bishops at the convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Portland, Oregon, asking that grape juice be substituted for wine in the holy communion or that clergy with whom the matter had become "a question of conscience" be permitted to use grape juice.

The petition came from the diocese of Los Angeles and was presented by Bishop Johnson of Los Angeles. It was referred to the Committee on Constitutional Amendments. The petition is considered a move to add prohibition.

"The commission believes that in the near future the sentiment will be strong throughout the church that women should be admitted to membership in the House of Deputies."

On motion of Bishop Manning of New York, who led the devotion today, the bishop this afternoon rescinded the action of yesterday in asking for a reopening of the question of giving to Suffragan Bishops a vote in the House of Bishops. The motion also asked that the House of Deputies review their official message of yesterday, which was that a committee on conference from the two houses be appointed. It is believed this will be the death knell in this convention of the move to get the vote for Suffragans. Bishop Anderson of Chicago and Bishop Gurry of South Carolina spoke against the recall.

Bishop Manning asserted that the House of Bishops, in asking for a committee on conference, had done a most unparliamentary thing in the view of the best known legal authorities at the convention.

There are two Suffragans in New York. One is the Right Rev. Arthur

S. Lloyd and the other is the Right Rev. Herbert Shipman. The diocese of Arkansas is the only other with two Suffragans. One is white and one a negro.

In the House of Deputies another attempt was made to sidetrack any revision of the prayer book. Judge George F. Henry of Des Moines presented a resolution to appoint a "sifting committee," but it was lost by a large majority.

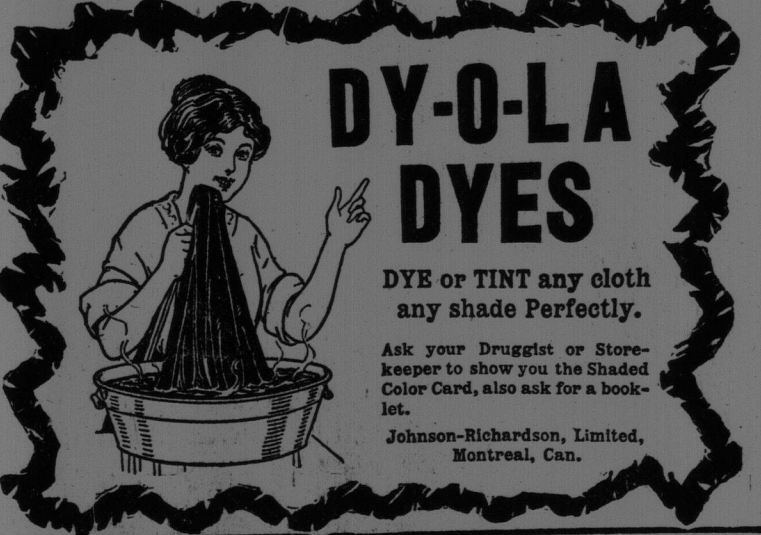
The House of Deputies this afternoon passed a resolution to create, the House of Bishops concurring, a special committee of one bishop, one clergyman and one layman to wait on Secretary Hughes and ask him to take such action as is possible against the growing use of opium in this country. The Rev. W. H. Bliss of Olympia, Wash., said there were about 2,000,000 opium addicts in the United States and that many girls and boys were being led to immorality through its use.

After a session behind closed doors which lasted two hours the House of Bishops late this afternoon accepted the resignation of the Right Rev. Robert L. Paddock as Bishop of Eastern Oregon. Bishop Paddock is in New York, where some months ago he suffered a nervous breakdown. The report of the Special Committee on Bishop Paddock's case was presented by Bishop Winchester of Arkansas, and was as follows:

"Your committee respectfully reports:

"That as Bishop Paddock's medical specialists have agreed that an invalid's chair or something worse will be ahead of him if he continues his work in Eastern Oregon, there is no course open to this house but to accept his resignation. Moreover, we believe that in kindness to him, it is desirable that his resignation be accepted at once, in order that his condition be not further aggravated by any suspense in this matter."

"Your committee knows, however, that Bishop Paddock's resignation will be received with profound regret. We shall lose from the missionary field a leader whose work has been of a peculiarly apostolic character. His life in the episcopate has been conspicuous for its self-denial and saintliness. The whole church has been waiting with the deepest interest an experiment in self-support unique in the missionary history of the American Church. It is a cause of sorrow to us all that Bishop Paddock is not able to go on with his attempt which has produced results beneficial to this

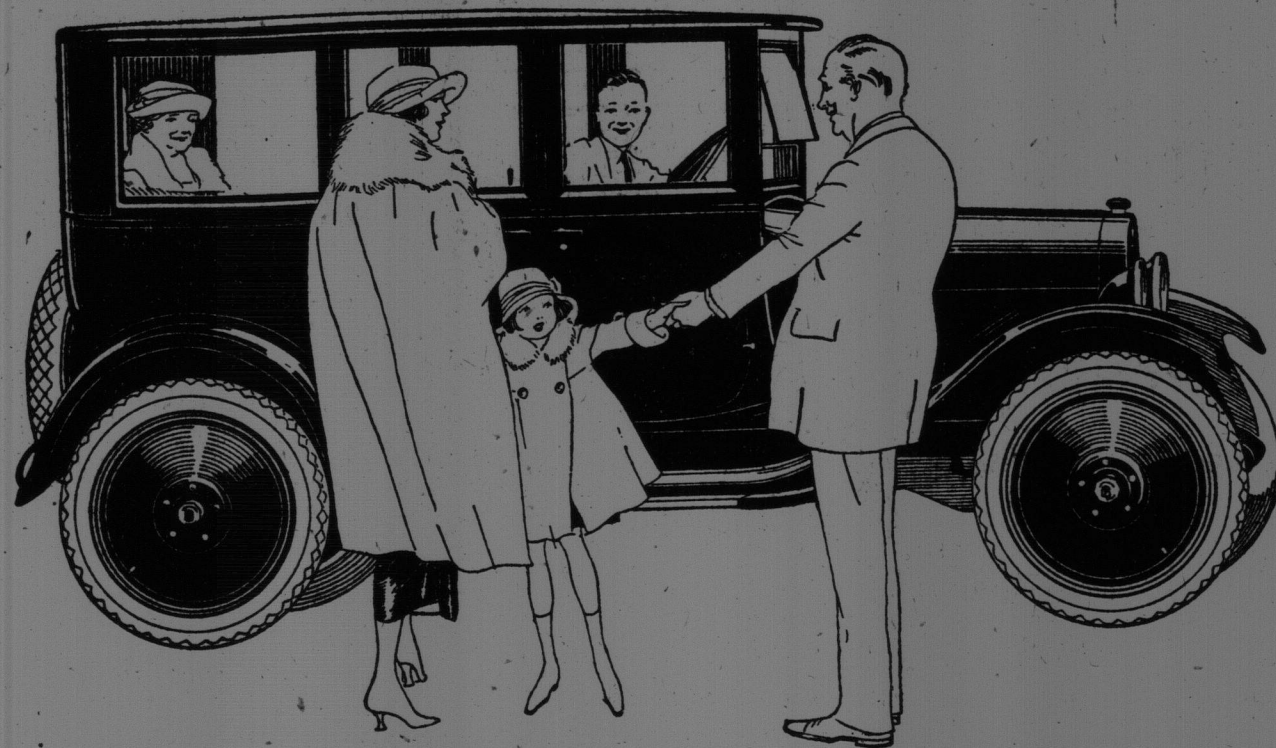
