BAPTIST CONVENTION OF ONTARIO AND QUEBEC

Toronto, Jan. 18.—Rev. Dr. O. C. S. Wallace of Westmont, Quebec, was unanimously elected president of the Baptist convention of Ontario and Quebec at yesterday afternoon's session of the annual convention. Rev. William Corkery of Hamilton was elected first vice-president; Rev. G. R. McFall of Ottawa, second vice-president, and Rev. MacLeod was re-elected secretary.
This resolution, dealing with pastors' salaries, was adopted: "There shall be a first charge on all income resulting from the forward movement which shall give the house mission board an additional income, equal to eight per cent of last year's budget. The convention, in adopting this, urges all churches, other than those under home mission board, to adopt a similar standard of minimum salary." The minimum salary referred to in the resolution is \$1,000 a year.
The financial report of McMaster University showed receipts from all sources \$77,274.

BRITISH PUBLIC EAGER TO SECURE WAR BONDS

London, Jan. 17.—(British Wireless Service).—The rush which began Monday to obtain war bonds before they are withdrawn has increased daily. The banks have been deluged with applications and the post offices have been besieged by small investors, anxious to follow the lead given them by big financial and commercial houses.
The treasury hopes that the final total on Jan. 18, the last day for applications, will reach the sum of £1,600,000,000.
