MORNING WAR SUMMARY

New York, Oct. 7.—The Associated Press tonight issued the following:  
The troops of the French General Beucler have delivered a successful blow against the Germans north-west of Rheims which adds materially to the menace that is hanging over the German front from the North Sea to the Swiss border. This was the capture of Berry-Aube, on the north side of the Aisne about ten and a half miles south-west of Rheims and only a short distance from the eastern edge of the famous Chemin-des-Dames ridge at Craonne. A further advance against the Germans was made and the line was pushed forward to the east of the Aisne. The capture of Berry-Aube is a serious blow in the loss to the French of Beucler, capital of the Visey region. The occupation of this strategic point on the Mediterranean by a French naval division gives the Allies a base for the landing of men who can operate in all directions against the Turks over the roads radiating from it.

THE FAR-FLUNG LINE

(N. Y. Times Editorial.)  
From the English Channel to the River Jordan the whole battlefield is flaming, and all along it rings the news of victory. Only on the Italian front is there no great operation under way and we know enough of the plan of campaign by now to be sure that that front is waiting orders. It may be that the Bulgarian defeat is the thing to unleash that front.  
There never was such a far-flung battle-line in the history of the world; a battle-line that begins in Belgium and reaches to Palestine, practically all in action at once. While the Belgians and Serbs dash forward to reclaim their homes, Jewish troops help to win back their ancestral places. The battle-line begins in the flat lands of Belgium, stretches across the north and east of France, dips down to the Macedonian desert and turns south down the border of the Syrian desert, into which battered remnants of the destroyed Turkish armies are fleeing. Victory everywhere, everywhere "the line" is being pushed forward after short triumphs, or recoils, the sons of liberty "lying at night" with the bumper of calvary-mountain, or demom on incantation; which no son of night can stand.  
And even this is not all; for there are other battle-lines. There is a battle-line in North Russia, where the German-paid troops of the Bolsheviks are being driven back, and one in Siberia, where the Germans themselves and their Bolshevik allies are being forced across a continent. But the eyes of the world are not fixed there, but on the one great battle-line that runs from Flanders southeast to the Plain of Armageddon. British cavalry scored that plain the other day, driving back the Turks; this more than continental battle would not have been dramatically completed with the feature left out.

MODERN SURGERY AT FRONT.

U. S. Doctors Perform Major Operations in Sound of the Guns.

With the American Forces in France, Sept. 20.—(Associated Press Correspondence)—Within forty minutes after arriving at an advance station behind the firing line some of the mobile operating units attached to the American army are ready to receive wounded soldiers for major operations. Ordinarily the unit is stationed near a base hospital, a call from near the firing line, it consists of sixty-four officers, fifty nurses and nearly 800 enlisted men and is composed of five sections, each of which is a complete operating group with a chief surgeon and an assistant. Students from the University of Cleveland and who were trained at Allen, Penn., compose the majority of the enlisted personnel.  
Having arrived behind the firing line, the unit unloads its equipment and provides beds under canvas for wounded men and must provide all the accessories of a modern hospital for immediate use. The operating pavilion is a tent erected over a metal floor, the outfit includes X-ray plants and sterilizing appliances. Electricity for light and for operation of the X-ray outfit is supplied by a motor and dynamo carried on a truck. By these advanced methods surgeons are saving human lives today in cases where a few years ago the patient would have been counted as mortally wounded. This is partly due to the fact that with this modern equipment and swift movement the most difficult and delicate operations may be performed efficiently.

COAL ORDERED TAKEN FROM CITIZEN'S CELLAR

Toronto Fuel Commissioner Takes Drastic Step to Enforce Regulation

(Toronto Star.)  
Fuel Commissioner Chisholm means business. The regulation forbidding any citizen having more than 70 per cent of his regular winter supply of coal in his cellar is being enforced.

The order was issued after a complaint was received by the commissioner that such a case was the case. This was shown today when an order was sent to a certain dealer to remove several tons of coal from the cellar of a residence where he lived. The order was imperative that the coal be taken from the cellar. This is the first time that such drastic action has been taken in Toronto.

Commissioner Chisholm would not say in what district the resident lived, from whose cellar the coal was removed, nor who the dealer was who was ordered to remove it. Neither the dealer nor the dealer who was ordered to remove it would bear the cost of taking the coal out. The dealer knew the regulations, and that his customer had his full 70 per cent of his regular supply of coal in his cellar. "Therefore, I simply put it up to him to make it right with the customer," the commissioner emphasized in the strongest manner the necessity of every citizen conserving coal to the utmost. The people of Toronto, he declared, must realize the seriousness of the fuel situation throughout Canada and the United States.

Use Soft Coal.

In Massachusetts, he declared, "the people have been forbidden to light fires until the 1st of December. Not even wood may be used until that date. That will serve to indicate how real the coal shortage is."

A Wild Goose Chase

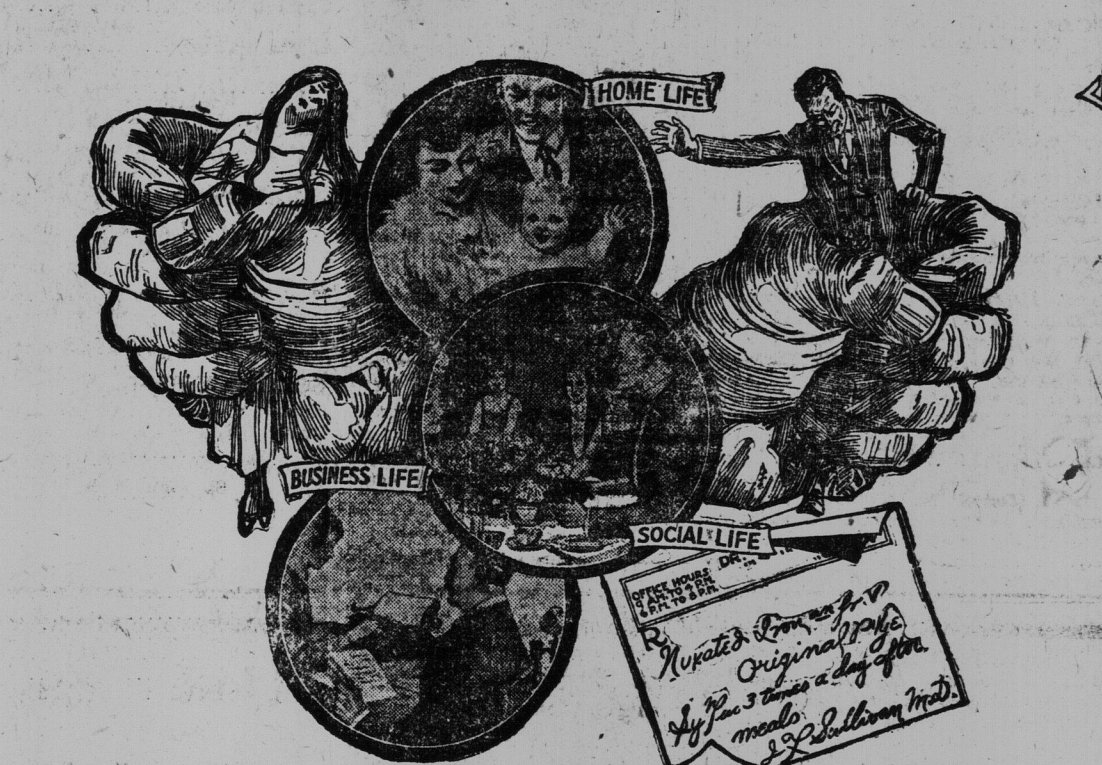

It was even reported that the coal could be secured at \$10 per ton.
