## Easy & Practical Home Dress Making Lessons

A LITTLE FRENCH DESIGN.



The new cow-boy collar, one of the latest features of small girls' frocks, is featured on this little dress of French cotton crepe. It is trimmed with dark silk.

Interesting little details are worked out on the new frocks for small girls this season. The cow-boy collar shown here is attractive and apt to appeal to the youthful heart that worships the heroic.

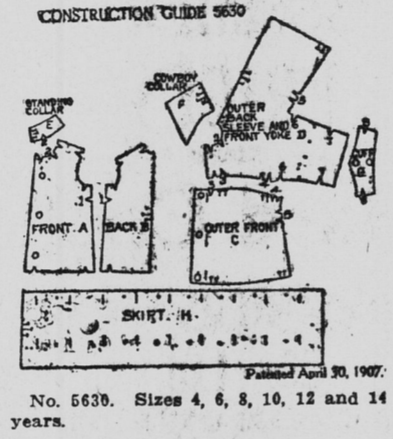
The dress is carried out in challis, marquisette, muslin, velvet or French cotton crepe, all of which are soft and inexpensive. It is made with a body lining. The outer back, sleeves and front yoke are cut in one piece. The skirt is pleated and attached to the

long blouse in the regular way. Belt and necktie are of dark silk. About 3 yards of 44-inch material will make the dress for a girl of 8 or 10 years. Three-quarters yard of silk and 1 1/4 yards of 27-inch lining will also be needed.

The lining requires but a few minutes to make, as it requires only the closing of the underarm seam and hemming of the front.

Tuck the front and stitch about an inch from the folded edge, then turn hem in right front on large "O" perforations, which also indicate center-front. After gathering the upper and lower edges of the front sew the yoke to the upper edge, then try on the dress. Alterations should not be necessary, but if any little change is made do it at this point. After closing the underarm seams finish the sleeves, adding cuff. Arrange on the lining, being careful to make the centers even, then stitch the dress together, bringing corresponding small "o" perforations in outer back and in collar together.

The skirt is laid in pleats, according to perforations and attached to the long blouse. The sash and buttons are then added, each being finished with a large flat bow. While it is a little detail, care should be used in making the bow for the sash and the one for the neck. They should be different to avoid regularity.

### Hints for the Cook

#### Steamed Chocolate Pudding.

One egg, half cup sugar, one tablespoonful butter, half cup of milk, one cup flour, half teaspoonful cream of tartar, quarter teaspoonful soda, one square melted chocolate. Steam one hour. Serve with whipped cream, hot.

#### Filled Cookies.

One cup sugar, half cup butter, one egg, half cup milk, two teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar, one teaspoonful soda, one of vanilla, pinch of salt, flour to roll.

Filling—One cup chopped raisins, half cup sugar, half cup cold water, one tablespoonful flour. Cook and cool. Roll cookies thin and put filling between two. Bake in quick oven.

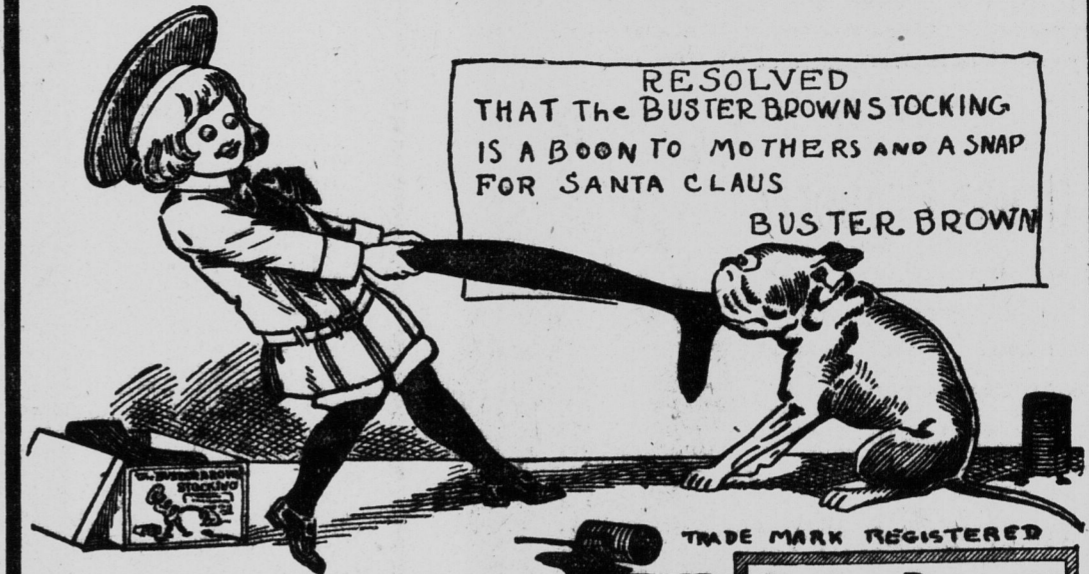
