The "Penquin Island" as conceived by
Anatole France will shortly be a reality. The republic of France, by decree
signed by President Doumergue, has
set aside Kerguelan Island, one of the
southmost islands in the Indian ocean. southmost islands in the Indian ocean, as a refuge for antarctic animal life.

The Kerguelan island is now chiefly inhabited by penguins. Vessels rarely call there, usually months apart. Expeditions in the past have practically cleaned out the animal life, but penguins flourish there, and now they are going to be protected, and allowed to thrive unmolested.
